
## Glinda Pareso

## **Tri-City Corvette Club Meeting Minutes**

August 2, 2022

#### **PRESIDENT**

Glinda called the meeting to order. She called for a moment of silence for all of those who have served and those currently serving in uniform. John Berry opened the meeting with a prayer. The membership recited the Pledge of Allegiance. All officers and board members were present with the exception of John Decker and Brad Metz who were unable to attend.

Several drive up to 2 hours each way. Thank you. Glinda then called on the officers and board members for reports to the membership.

#### OFFICER/BOARD MEMBER REPORTS

- **SECRETARY LIZ HANLEY**: Liz said she had received a copy of the Corvette magazine from the NCM for the club and offered it to any member who may not have received their copy. She asked the membership if they would like to have her read the minutes from the last meeting or, since they are published in our newsletter, would they like to adopt the minutes as published. Rod Johnstone moved we accept the minutes as published in the newsletter and Cecelia Mouton seconded the motion and the motion passed. Noone opposed.
- TREASURER MONA BERRY: Mona reported that the check had been written and sent to the NCM to cover our dues for year 2022-2023 for 60 members. She gave a summary of all expenditures and any deposits. She stated she is still learning the system but progressing well, and that she will have a completed budget soon.
- BOARD MEMBER JOHN BERRY: John reported that the run to Hurricane Tita's was a huge success with 21 cars
  and 35 people participating. Food and place were great, and John thanked Bill Hanley for the suggestion. He
  mentioned that he was looking at a possible 1st Annual Halloween Party and will have more details at the September meeting. He is also looking at other possibilities for fellowship other than ride and dine which may include bowling, bingo, trivia night etc.. He also mentioned that we may be able to do a mystery dinner in October. John said he
  is always interested in hearing suggestions from the membership, so please give him any ideas you may have for
  activities.
- BOARD MEMBER COACH BURGESS: Coach gave us an update on the food bank. They are still working to get a
  video together highlighting the services they offer to the community. Last months donation to the food bank from
  money collected from our membership was \$110.00.
- BOARD MEMBER MICHAEL MERIDETH: The new date for Cars and Pets for the Humane Society is either the
  first or second weekend in December. Jefferson County Child Welfare is doing a back to school drive, and you can
  go on amazon.com and purchase school supplies that will be given to some of the 300 plus children in the Jefferson County system.

- PAST PRESIDENT MIKE WHITE: Mike went over the contents of the new membership packets. They are almost complete. The pens we ordered came in, and he distributed them to the members present. The website has been cleaned up and updated. He urged everyone to check it out. He will be meeting with the hotel in about a month to finalize the contract for the car show. He informed the membership that our flyer is being updated to state that anyone staying at the hotel must book with the hotel directly to be eligible to receive a gift basket. He is also checking to see if sponsors may want to provide a banner promoting their business to display at the car show.

## **NCM Motorsports Park Improvements**



### **NCM Holley Tower**

**BOWLING GREEN, KY, July 14, 2022** – Today, the National Corvette Museum announced plans for \$2.4 Million in improvements to the museum's Motorsports Park. In December of 2021, the NCM Motorsports Park was heavily damaged when an EF-3 tornado touched down in Bowling Green. The National Corvette Museum and its board of directors decided to leverage the unfortunate circumstances of the tornado to create opportunity. Instead of simply restoring the Motorsports Park to pre-tornado conditions, the National Corvette Museum is planning significant improvements to the park's facilities.

National Corvette Museum President and CEO Sharon Brawner said of the planned improvements, "The National Corvette Museum, along with our board of directors, looked at the extent of the damage to the Motorsports Park and decided to find the silver lining in a really difficult circumstance. The improvements we have planned will take our already world-class racing facility to the next level, including much-needed indoor and outdoor event spaces, bar and restaurant offerings in our track observation areas, and upgraded garage facilities."

The NCM Motorsports Park, which is located on 185 acres of property adjacent to I-65 in Bowling Green, opened in 2014. Designed by legendary race track designer Steve Crawford, the road course was created with input from Corvette Racing, resulting in a multiple, reconfigurable track layout with features from Le Mans. According to Greg Waldron, Executive Director of the NCM Motorsports Park, the planned improvements will allow track participants, observers, and other guests to experience a level of facilities on par with the excellence of the track itself. "We want all of the guests who visit the Motorsports Park to have an exceptional experience," said Waldron. "With the addition of these new amenities and reimagined spaces, the Motorsports Park will be the foremost racing and karting destination in the Southeast."

The NCM Motorsports Park will remain open during construction, and the project is currently slated for completion by early 2024. Visitors can currently enjoy C8 Corvette driving experiences, track rentals for personal vehicle driving and racing, and high-speed go-karts. The Motorsports Park also offers league racing and group karting in addition to corporate and private events. More information on the NCM Motorsports Park can be found at MotorsportsPark.org.

## **NCM MOTORSPORTS PARK**



Have a need for SPEED? The NCM Motorsports Park is located less than two miles from the museum and offers the chance for you to ride in a Corvette, drive your car on the road course for a lap, participate in a high performance driving school and/or spectate at one of many motorsports events going on throughout the season.

Don't have a performance car? No worries! The track offers Hot Laps where one of our professional drivers will take you for a spin in a Corvette or you can drive one of the track's C8 Corvette Stingray Z51s for a few laps in a lead/follow format. Laps are available when the track is not in use for an event. When planning a trip, you are welcome to call ahead to check availability and make an appointment. No appointment? Give us a heads up when you are in town and we will do our best to accommodate you for a ride!

#### **Hot Laps**

One session includes pit out, one time by, and pit in (approximately two laps around our Grand Full Course). Minimum age to participate is 15. Average speeds top 100 MPH.

Cost: \$125/session

#### C8 Corvette Touring Laps

One session includes four laps in the track's C8 Corvette Stingray Z51 in a lead/follow format. Minimum age to drive is 18. Must sign a Vehicle Damage Policy and Indemnity Agreement.

Cost: \$220/session

If you have your own car to drive on the track, consider a Touring Lap.

#### **Touring Laps**

One session includes four laps in your own car at average highway speeds in a lead/follow format. Passengers 14 years or older are welcome.

Cost: \$50/session

Gift certificates are available for laps.

Laps are available weekdays when the track is not rented and during select National Corvette Museum sponsored events and activities. Laps are offered on the hour, every hour, starting at 1:00am CT and ending at 2:00pm CT. Please call in advance to give the Motorsports Park staff a heads up that you'd like to participate so that cars and equipment are ready when you arrive.
